Reality Television

Reality television is a genre of television programming that documents supposedly real-life situations, often starred by unknown individuals rather than professional actors. It first emerged as a distinct genre in the early 1990s and achieved prominence in the early 2000s with the success of the series *Survivor*, *Idols* and *Big Brother*, all of which became global franchises.

The authenticity of reality television is often called into question by its detractors. The genre's title of "reality" is often criticized as being inaccurate. Some critics say that the genre frequently includes elements such as premeditated scene development to create specified situations of adversity and drama. In many cases, the entire idea of the show is contrived, based around a competition or another unusual situation.

Reality television's global successes has become, in the view of some analysts, an important political phenomenon. In some authoritarian countries, reality-television voting has provided the first opportunity for many citizens to vote in any free and fair wide-scale "elections". In addition, the frankness of the settings on some reality shows presents situations that are often taboo in certain conservative cultures, like *Star Academy Arab World* which began airing in 2003, and which shows male and female contestants living together.

As we see, reality television has faced significant criticism since its rise in popularity. Critics argue that reality television shows do not accurately reflect reality, in ways both implicit (participants being placed in artificial situations), and deceptive (misleading editing, participants being told on what to do or to say, storylines previously generated and not "spontaneous", etc). Other criticisms of reality television shows include that they are intended to humiliate or exploit participants; that they make stars out of untalented people who should not become famous because they do not really have a talent; and that they glamorize vulgarity.
